But it can be a stress living with someone who doesn't really like who you are. And most women in the sex industry like men, which is why they make good partners.

I believe that being pretty is helpful in the

sex industry, as it is in any endeavour, but it is not the guarantee of success that you might think it is. I have known some very beautiful girls who were not successful. They tended to believe that whatever came to them was due to them. And I believe that beautiful girls, unless they have very rare insight into themselves, don't see these attitudes.

I believe it is important in any profession to be able to deal with rejection.

I believe it is important

– and this will sound very



weird from someone who has done this job – not to make a man feel like a utility vehicle. Men want to feel like they are entertaining us, even when they are paying.

I believe that women should be practical about relationships.

I believe that guilt is only useful if it turns you on.

I believe that it's important to keep a man wanting more. I didn't kiss my clients. A lot of my clients came back for years hoping that they were going to get to kiss me.

I believe that, although I am a Catholic, the church cannot tell me what to do.

I believe in star signs, against my better judgement and much more than I should.

I believe in marriage. Every culture has it, so there must be something to it.

I believe that marriage comes with inherent problems. The only way to maintain your sanity is to be slightly unfaithful to the marriage every day — not sexually, but you have to feel like you are cheating on that relationship in some way. That's why squabbles can help you to keep a marriage alive.

I believe that call girls make the best wives and girlfriends. We can look

at a man objectively and see
